

WEBBERVILLE HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To receive a diploma from Webberville High School a student must meet the following criteria:

- All students grades 9-12 are required to enroll in seven periods a day for four years.
- Students must have a minimum of 26 credits.
- Students must meet all departmental requirements:

4 credits Language Arts- Must take English 9, 10, 11, and English 12 or College Prep.

3 credits Mathematics

3 credits Science- Must take Physical Science or Physics

3 credits Social Studies- Must take World History, U.S. History, Government/Economics

½ credit Physical Education- Participation in a varsity sport will fulfill P.E. requirement

½ credit Health

1 credit Fine/Performing Arts

1 credit Computer Literacy

MICHIGAN MERIT CURRICULUM

Beginning with the class of 2011, the Michigan Merit Curriculum will become standard as the statewide set of graduation requirements. The requirements are as follows:

| <u># of Credits</u> | <u>Subject Area</u> | <u>Required Content</u> |
|---------------------|----------------------|--|
| 4 Credits | Mathematics | Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, one credit in senior year |
| 4 Credits | English | Aligned with subject area content expectations |
| 3 Credits | Science | Biology, Physics or Chemistry, one additional science credit |
| 3 Credits | Social Studies | ½ credit Civics, ½ credit Economics, U.S. History and Geography, World History and Geography |
| 1 Credit | P.E./Health | Credit guidelines developed by state Dept. of Education |
| 1 Credit | Visual/Perform. Arts | Credit guidelines developed by state Dept. of Education |

Additional Graduation Requirements:

Online Learning Experience: Students must take an online course or learning experience; OR have the online learning experience incorporated into any of the required credits of the Michigan Merit Curriculum.

World Languages: Beginning with the class of 2016, students will need to complete two credits of world language in grades 9-12; OR have an equivalent learning experience in grades K-12.
